Our first annual non-commercial family-friendly multi-cultural Celebration of the Season was held at Park Hall on Saturday, December 21st. The day-long event included hot beverages and bonfires outside in the park, wagon rides, children's activities in the lower hall, ethnic food for lunch, a German dinner from the Dorf Haus, a full schedule of presentations which included the following:
