Farm/Art DTour to Rural Mexico Celebrating Rural Diversity

Don't miss a special three-course food pairing and mezcal tasting **6:30 to 8:30 p.m.**, **Friday**, **October 11**, presented by **Wormfarm Institute! EI Tigre Mezcal**, a cultural initiative, will share the traditional knowledge of the process of artisanal mezcal production at **Patricio Garcia**'s family chivita (mezcal factory) in Guerrero, Mexico, paired with three fresh interpretations of classic Mexican cuisine by **Chef Ursulino Rueda** of El Gusto Historico in Mexico City. Each course will be made with local Wisconsin ingredients, including nixtamalized corn tortillas from **Tortilleria Zepeda**, and served with a "copita" of traditional mezcal that represents the ancestral wisdom of the communities that cultivate the agave plant.

Collaborators will invite participants to discover the tradition of mezcal from the lower mountains of the state of Guerrero, and blend local Wisconsin flavor with Mexican culinary knowledge, drawing parallels and divergences between rural identities in Mexico and the United States. Participants will gain a fuller understanding of the origins of this unique spirit, and the reverence and agricultural values that elevate it beyond a mere beverage, to a social symbol of celebration, medicine, and cultural memory.

The event will take place at Freethinkers Hall in Sauk City, WI. Tickets are \$125 and space is limited, so <u>register today</u>!

This event is organized in conjunction with the Farm/Art DTour (October 5-14), a free self-guided 50-mile excursion through Sauk County's scenic farmland, punctuated by site-responsive artworks, pasture performances, roadside poetry, local markets, and more.
